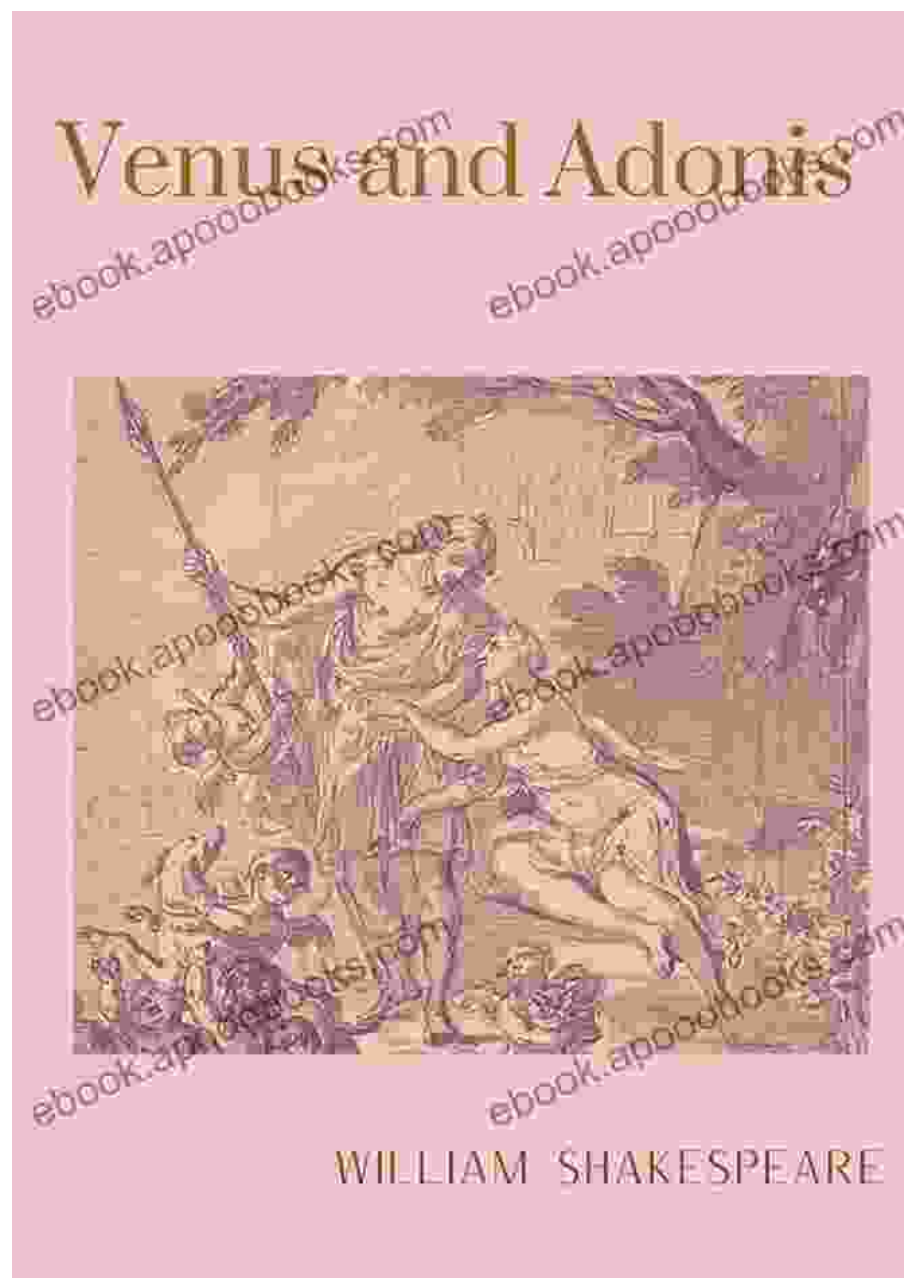
That time of year thou mayst in me behold
