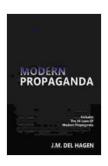

How to Protect Yourself from Propaganda

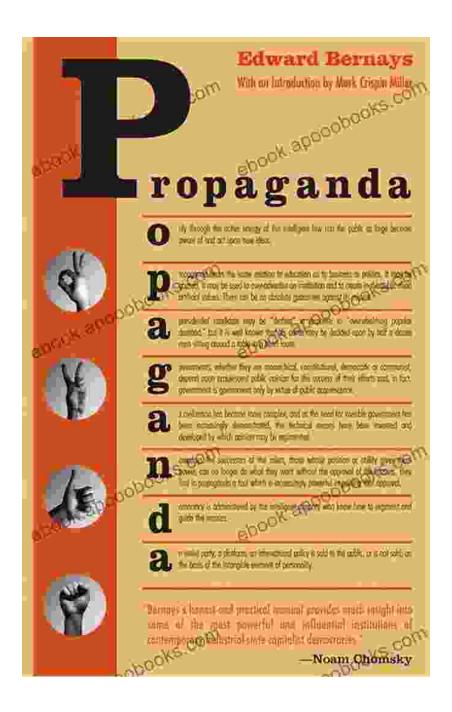
